The horrific fires which devastated such large areas of koala habitat in the Adelaide Hills saw 1300KOALAZ rally to ferry injured koalas to appropriate facilities for treatment.

This included bringing them into care with our team of permit holding carers.

As many of our team are also members of SAVEM (South Australian Veterinary Emergency Management) some were also deployed into Kangaroo Island to help with the devastation and care for the injured koalas. It was an extremely busy and difficult time for many of our rescuers and carers.





After a public outcry at the removal of 120, 300 year old gum trees at the site of road upgrades, 1300KOALAZ was asked by the media to comment on numbers of koalas killed in that area.

This led to the Department of Planning and Infrastructure (DPTI) contacting us. After meeting with them we have been invited to consult on any areas of major road works to advise of koala vehicle strike hotspots and make recommendations to reduce the impact.

Where there is the chance of ongoing vehicle strike DPTI are making the public aware of koalas being in the area and giving our 1300KOALAZ number to ring in case of an accident involving wildlife.

1300KOALAZ have also been busy forging links with community groups such as the Girl Guides and Hope Valley Scout group. These are our wildlife warriors of tomorrow and it is great to get them interested from a young age. We have been lucky enough to be able to release some of our koalas at the Guides Blewitt Springs camp area.

Here we have also been able to place a gunya to check climbing abilities pre release.

The gunya was kindly donated by Adelaide Airport Bunnings and was erected by their management team.
